

ORDINANCE NO. 1514

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE DRAPER CITY COUNCIL REPEALING 3-5-090 "DRAPER CITY
EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS COMMITTEE"
OF THE DRAPER CITY MUNICIPAL CODE**

WHEREAS, Ordinance 700 established the Draper City Emergency Preparedness Committee; and

WHEREAS, in 2021 the Draper City Council has reviewed the City's subordinate bodies and made changes to several subordinate bodies and the procedures by which subordinate bodies operate; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the operation of the Draper City Emergency Preparedness Committee; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined emergency planning for Draper City can be managed internally with the Draper Fire Department taking the lead on emergency planning; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has reviewed the proposed text amendment and finds good cause to repeal Section 3-5-090 of the Draper City Municipal Code.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF DRAPER CITY, STATE OF UTAH, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Repeal. Section 3-5-090 "Draper City Emergency Preparedness Committee" of the Draper City Municipal Code is hereby repealed as shown in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Correction of Editing Errors. The City Attorney is authorized to correct any punctuation, spelling, formatting, or similar errors prior to submitting the Ordinance to the codifier.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, part, or provision of this Ordinance is held invalid, or unenforceable, such invalidity or unenforceability shall not affect

any other portion of this Ordinance, and all sections, parts, and provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable.

Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon publication or posting, or 30 days after final passage, whichever is closer to the date of final passage.

EXHIBIT A

~~3-5-090 — Draper City Emergency Preparedness Committee:~~

~~A.— Creation: There is hereby created an Emergency Preparedness Committee for Draper City to recommend and monitor the establishment of emergency preparedness plans and to facilitate the provision of City services during natural disaster situations and other emergencies.~~

~~B.— Members:~~

~~1.— Number: The Emergency Preparedness Committee shall be comprised of an Executive Committee of voting members and non-voting Community Sub-Committee members. The Executive Committee voting members shall be comprised of the Draper City Manager or designee, the Draper City Police Chief or designee, the Draper City Public Works Director or designee, the designated Draper City Emergency Manager, the Draper City Public Information Officer, a representative from the Unified Fire Authority, the Chair of the Draper City Emergency Preparedness District Representative Committee, a representative from Water Pro, a representative from the Canyons School District, a representative from Salt Lake County Emergency Services, a representative from Juan Diego High School, a representative from the Fire-Wise Program community, a representative from Draper Area Chamber of Commerce, a representative from Lone Peak Hospital and other voting members that may be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council. Non-voting members of the Community Sub-Committee shall be comprised of citizens and stakeholders within the community who desire to participate and provide input on emergency services related matters or have specialized knowledge or experience that will benefit the work of the Emergency Preparedness Committee. Other than those specified voting members identified by this subsection, other voting members shall only be appointed by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the City Council. Non-voting Community Sub-Committee members shall be approved by the Executive Committee Chair of the Emergency Preparedness Committee, with the advice and consent of the voting members of the Executive Committee.~~

~~2.— Officers: The Executive Committee of the Emergency Preparedness Committee shall select a Secretary and a Treasurer who shall serve for a term of two (2) years.~~

~~3.— Executive Committee Chair: The Mayor shall appoint the Executive Committee Chair with the advice and consent of the City Council.~~

~~4.— By-Laws: The Emergency Preparedness Committee shall establish by-laws to govern the conduct of meetings and other matters within the discretion of the committee.~~

~~5.—Term: Members of the Executive Committee serve terms of four (4) years. Except for the Chair of the Draper City Emergency Preparedness District Representative Committee, who is selected by the district representatives to serve a one-year term. The Chair of the Draper City Emergency Preparedness District Representative Committee shall serve on the Executive Committee during their specified elected term. Members may serve an unlimited number of terms, if reappointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of the City Council. Community Sub-Committee members serve terms of four (4) years. Community Sub-Committee members may serve unlimited terms, if reappointed by the Executive Committee Chair with the advice and consent of the voting members of the Executive Committee.~~

~~6.—Removal: The Mayor and City Council are under no obligation to approve any proposed appointment and may remove any Executive Committee member at their discretion. Community Sub-Committee members may be removed by the Executive Committee Chair with the consent of the Mayor.~~
