APPENDIX A: DRAPER PARKS, RECREATION AND TRAILS MASTER PLAN UPDATE SURVEY 2022 RESULTS



KEY FINDINGS

- 1. Overall satisfaction with Draper parks and recreation facilities is high
 - Draper residents are highly satisfied with the provision of parks and rec facilities, with well over 80% of respondents saying they are satisfied. Respondents who are very physically active are more likely to say they are satisfied with parks and rec opportunities in the City.

2. Respondents use Draper trails and parks/facilities often, and they like having them close by

- A majority of respondents, 55%, say they use Draper parks (or fields and rec facilities) a few times a month or more, and, cumulatively, around 70% respondents are using Draper parks at least once a month. Additionally, over 70% of respondents say having parks close to them is important.
- Nearly 2/3 of respondents, 63%, say they use trails a few times a month or more, and, cumulatively, about 3/4 of respondents are using trails at least once a month. Most respondents, about 2/3, spent between 1 and 2 hours on trails when they use them.

3. Nearly all respondents say they are satisfied with arts and cultural events in Draper


- Nearly 80% of respondents say Draper provides an adequate amount of arts and cultural events, and respondents particularly enjoy the Draper Days events. Respondents are interested in Draper City offering more concerts.
- <u>Preserving natural space</u> and <u>improving recreational facilities</u> has broad support among respondents
 In terms of future development projects, purchasing and preserving more natural open space is the potential priority area that has the most support (around 1 in 5 respondents allocate some portion of their hypothetical budget to this initiative).

5. Most residents are willing to support parks and recreation funding measures

 On average, respondents would be willing to pay \$64 more per year in property taxes to fund parks and rec development and operation. Additionally, 77% of respondents are at least somewhat willing to pay a nominal annual usage fee to fund park maintenance and upgrades.

SURVEY METHODOLOGY

- 593 residents within the boundaries of Draper City participated in this online survey
- Interviews were collected from November 6-24, 2021
- Data have been weighted to reflect population statistics from the U.S. Census to ensure that the sample is representative of the City as a whole, specifically regarding age, gender, and home ownership
- Margin of error +-4.0 percentage points



OVERALL PERCEPTIONS, LIFESTYLE TRENDS



OVERALL SATISFACTION WITH PARKS AND REC IS HIGH

A solid majority of our respondents (around 85%) say that the quality of parks and recreation opportunities in Draper is good or excellent, that the city provides an adequat number of parks and recreational facilities, and they are satisfied with the programs and facilities provided. Those who are very physically active are more likely to find Draper parks and rec to be of high quality and satisfactory than those who are not.



Those who are very physically active were more likely to say the overall quality of Draper parks and rec is good and say that they are satisfied with it. However, they were equally likely to say Draper provides an adequate amount.




TRAILS, POOLS, PLAYGROUNDS MOST UTILIZED

When asked their physical activity, 54% of respondents say they are "very" or "somewhat" active. The Draper City recreational facilities most utilized by respondents is trails, with 67% of respondents having used paved trails during the past year and 57% having used natural surface trails. Pools and playgrounds are also quite popular.


By far, Draper City parks and trails are seen as most important to residents, with 72% having marked it as in their top 3 most important facilities. Public lands fall close behind in terms of importance, followed by churches and school programs. Only 2% of residents indicate that their recreational needs are not being met.

PURCHASING & PRESERVING NATURAL SPACE A PRIORITY

Purchasing and preserving more natural open space is the category in which respondents are most likely to allocate money, as well as the category that receives the highest average dollar allocation. Recuetball courts and skate parks are seen as lower priorities in terms of budget allocation.

DRAPER CITY PARK MOST POPULAR LOCATION

Draper City Park is by far the most used facility, regarding both overall parks visited in the last 12 months, and of the parks visited the most frequently. While 58% of residents have visited Draper City Park during the past 12 months, fewer than 25% of residents have visited all other parks.





CURRENT PARK


TRENDS, FEELINGS

The vast majority (70%) of Draper residents use Draper City parks, trails, and recreation facilities at least once a month. An even larger majority (93%) consider it at least somewhat important to have a public park within walking distance of their home.



TIMBER RIDGE PARK NEEDS MOST IMPROVEMENT


Draper Recreation Center, Fielding Hill Park, and Brickerhaven Park are the facilities most widely considered "very well maintained" by residents. Timber Ridge Park and Inauguration Park stand out as the facilities most in need of improvement.






PARKS CLOSE TO HOME ARE MOST IMPORTANT


Being close to home is by far the most important reason that Draper residents frequent their most used park. Using the trails/jogging paths is a less common, albeit significant reason. When it comes to improving their most frequented park, a plurality of respondents (14%) say that no improvements are needed. Among those who do see a need for improvement, the most common requests made include constructing pickleball courts, enhancing maintenance and atmosphere, and improving lighting.





RESIDENTS WANT TO INCREASE FINES FOR DOG USERS

Residents are divided about whether dogs and their owners cause conflicts in parks and trails. Among those who express concern, nearly half prefer to resolve conflicts by increasing enforcement/fines . Just under a third say they prefer to create more off-leash doy areas and dedicated doy parks.



MOST RESIDENTS USE TRAILS REGULARLY

The majority (63%) of Draper residents use City trails a few times a month or more. Only 5% never use or visit City trails. Among those who do use City trails, the vast majority of residents spend 1-2 hours on the trails per visit, and only 12% typically spend less than per visit.

MOST RESIDENTS WANT TRAILS CLOSE BY

Nearly all Draper City residents (95%) say it is at least somewhat important to have a trail within walking distance of their home

MOST TRAILS CONSIDERED VERY WELL MAINTAINED


Draper residents consider the majority of Draper trails very well maintained. Little Valley Instructional trail is considered the most well-maintained. Mehraban Wetlands Trails are considered the trails most in need of improvement.



RESIDENTS PREFER TRAILS THAT ARE CLOSE TO HOME


A plurality of Draper residents use their favorite trail because it is close to home. Another significant proportion of residents use their favorite trail for recreational biking and walking/jogging. In terms of improving Draper trails, residents most commonly want more dog trails, restrooms, and paved trails.




DRAPER CITY PAVED TRAILS MOST VISITED TRAILS



RESIDENTS WANT MORE PAVED & MULTI-USE TRAILS

Residents are generally satisfied with the number of natural surface, one-way bike trails in the City and express the greatest interest in increasing the number of paved trails and natural surface multi-use trails in the City. Residents also express interest in having trails designated for specifically hikers rather than sharing trails with bikers.





ARTS & RECREATION PROGRAMS

RESIDENTS WANT SEPARATE TRAILS FOR DIFFERENT USES

Just over half of Draper residents agree that the various groups of trail users often conflict with one another. Among those who express concern, the majority prefer to solve this problem by creating separate, designated trails for the different user groups. Another common, albeit less popular solution would be to limit specific trail uses to certain days.





MOST ARE CONTENT WITH ARTS & CULTURAL EVENTS

The overwhelming majority of respondents (almost 80%) said the city provides an appropriate number of arts and cultural events. Only 18% said there were "not enough" and 4% said their were "too many." Recent move-ins and older residents are more likely to say there are not enough arts and cultural events.




Q: "Which of the following best describes your opinion about arts and cultural events in Draper?" (n=408)




DRAPER DAYS EVENTS ARE MOST POPULAR OVERALL

When asked which Draper City arts and cultural events respondents had participated in in the last 3 years, over half said they have participated in the Draper Days Concert and Fireworks. The Draper Days Parade and Tree Lighting Ceremony are also commonly attended. Sports tournaments, and races are among the least popular events.



SCHEDULING BIGGEST BARRIER TO PROGRAM PARTICIPATION

Among respondents who said they have not used a recreation facility in the past three years, a plurality report that having "more convenient program times" would be the most likely way to encourage them participate. Other likely ways to increase participation include providing more appealing activities, and higher quality programs.

LOW PARTICIPATION IN DRAPER RECREATION PROGRAMS

Overall, participation in formal Draper City recreation programs is very low. 82% of residents say that no one in their household has participated in adult programs and 60% say no one in their household participated in youth recreation programs. Of the programs offered, Junior Jazz and Youth soccer are by far the most popular offerings.

RESPONDENTS WANT TO SEE MORE CONCERTS IN DRAPER

When asked about other recreational activities they participate in, residents mention activities such as skiing, tennis, and pickleball (and a need for more tennis and pickleball courts) among other things. In terms of their interest of programs not currently offered in Draper, additional concerts, festivals, and food truck events were mentioned by a plurality of respondents.



RESIDENTS WOULD USE INDOOR TRACK, GYMNASIUM


When asked about indoor facilities they or members of their household would use, a plurality of Draper residents express interest in using an indoor running/walking track. An almost equal proportion say they would make use of a multi-purpose gymnasium. Few individuals express interest in using an indoor turf field or game room.




Potential recreation center offerings Draper residents would use

MAJORITY WILLING TO PAY MONTHLY \$5 USE FEE

The vast majority of respondents (77%) say they are at least somewhat willing to pay a monthly S5 use fee to fund maintenance and upgrades to existing facilities. Twentyfive percent say they are "very willing." Households with children, and middle-aged and senior respondents are more likely to say they are willing to pay the use fee.



FACILITIES, OPEN SPACE, OR TRAILS BOND TO RECEIVE MOST SUPPORT

Nearly a third (30%) of Draper residents suggest they would be more likely to support a bond for recreational facilities than any other potential amenity or funding category, though 18% indicate that would be their last choice. In terms of total support, funding for open space, trails, and parks are all popular options while funding for arts and cultural programs is much less popular. Forty-two percent of resident say they would be least likely to support a bond for funding arts and cultural programs.




FUNDING PARKS & RECREATION PRIORITIES

On average, respondents would be willing to pay \$64 more per year in property taxes to fund parks and recreation development and operation. Men, middle-aged respondents and those with children in their household are willing to pay more than average by a few dollars per year.





PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT ANALYSIS REPORT

January 2022





OVERVIEW KEY IDEAS

As of January 2022, the public engagement effort for the Draper City Parks, Recreation and Trails Master Plan included:

- A statically-valid survey
- A public open house
- A project website that included a comments form, interactive mapping tool, idea board and more
- Six focus group meetings

The website has received over 1,073 unique visitors, with roughly 180 of those visitors engaging with the interactive tools or submitting a comment. 360 comments were submitted via the project website, email or phone.

KEY TOPICS

Table 1 shows overall ranking of comment topics recieved through the public engagement process. Input includes comments from the public open house, written comments received through the project website and email, verbal comments received by phone, and other engagement modes on the project website, including an idea board and interactive mapping tool. Input from the six focus groups is also included in this document, though not included in the following analysis, as they contain special interests and do not necessarily represent the views of Draper residents.

Top 5 Topics

1. Additional Trail Connections

Thirty-one comments expressed a desire for additional trail connections, including connecting existing trails to other trails, parks, neighborhoods, businesses, and Draper's City Center. Several mentioned a desire to connect Corner Canyon to the Lehi Traverse Mountain trails. Overall, these comments received 177 likes and 5 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of 41:1.

2. Love Trails & Trailheads

Twenty-six comments expressed their love and appreciation for Draper's trail system as whole or for specific trails (particularly in Corner Canyon). These comments received 132 likes and 0 dislikes.

3. One-Way Bike Trails

Twenty-one comments suggested converting/creating more one-way bike trails. Many were concerned about the danger downhill bike traffic presents when conflicted with other users. They believe that more oneway trails will help mitigate this issue. These comments received 163 likes and 49 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of 4:1.

4. Single-Use Trails

Twelve comments expressed a need for more single-use trails (bike-only/ hike-only), in order to avoid conflicts between trail user types. These comments received 133 likes and 13 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of 11:1.

5. Trail Improvement & Maintenance

Twenty-three comments expressed a need for trail improvements or additional maintenance. Some of these improvements included lighting,



trash cans, weed removal, or more shade. Overall, these comments received 96 likes and 11 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of 9:1.

6. Additional Park Amenities

Thirty-one comments communicated a need for additional park amenities. Some of these amenities included playgrounds, fire pits, sports fields, a track, walking paths, and disc golf. These comments received 53 likes and 11 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of 8:1. The desire for tennis and pickleball courts was so overwhelming that they are grouped independently in this analysis (see Table 1).

7. Improved Road Crossings

Nine comments indicated concern for pedestrian and bicycle safety at road crossing, saying improved road crossing are needed. Key locations included the Porter Rockwell Trail at 1300 East and at the Hidden Canyon/ Eagle Crest Trail. These comments received 155 likes and zero dislikes.

8. More Pickleball

Fourteen commenter desire more/improved pickleball courts. For many the existing courts are too windy. Some suggested adding wind breaks while others desired more courts elsewhere in the community. Indoor courts were also suggested. These comments received 53 likes and 14 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of 5:1.

9. Park Improvements & Maintenance

Twenty-one comments expressed a need for park improvement or additional maintenance. Some of these improvements included lighting, shade, parking, dead tree replacement, and trash clean up. These comments received 29 likes and zero dislikes.

10. Love Parks

Six comments expressed their love and appreciation for Draper's park system as whole or for specific parks. These comments received 40 likes and zero dislikes.

Most Controversial Topics

The following topics had the lowest ratio of likes to dislikes, indicating these topics are controversial among residents:

- **Trails for Motorized Vehicles:** Seven comments expressed a desire for trails that permit motorized vehicles, particularly dirt bikes. These comments received 22 likes and 77 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of 1:4
- Alternating Bike/Dog Days on Trails: Two comments expressed a desire for trails to alternate days for bikes and dogs, similarly to how Millcreek Canyon operates. These comments received 11 likes and 20 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of approximately 1:3.
- **New Golf Course:** One comment suggested adding a new Golf Course to the City. The comment received zero likes and 4 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of approximately 1:4.
- **E-Bike Restrictions:** Five comments suggested regulating/ restricting E-bikes to help mitigate conflicts with other trail users. These comments received 42 likes and 24 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of approximately 2:1
- **Dog Parks & Off-Leash Dog Areas:** Fourteen comments expressed their desire/appreciation for dog parks and off-leash trails. These comments received 24 likes and 17 dislikes, creating a like to dislike ratio of approximately 2:1.

There were several other topics that received a substantial number of dislikes; however, they were vastly outnumbered by likes. These included "one-way bike trails" (163 likes, 49 dislikes), "capture revenue from non-residents" (29 likes, 14 dislikes), and "more/improved pickleball courts" (53 likes, 14 dislikes).

HOT SPOTS

The Comment Hot Spot Map on page six illustrates the areas within the City that received the most location-specific comments. The areas with the highest concentration of comments (shown in dark purple) include around Corner Canyon, Draper City Park, and the Draper City Cycle Park.



23. More Hiking-Only Trails

The longest loop is still a bit short for many runners without adding on extra miles on a multi-use trail. It would be great if the hiking only loops could be connected in some way with a hiking only connector.

Millcreek Canyon offers odd/even days where mountain bikers are allowed on even days and off leash dogs are allowed on odd days. May be a good way to handle heavy traffic at the busiest trails to separate pedestrian and mountain bike traffic?

Response: There are off leash parks. Off leash dogs are dangerous, not just to themselves but others. I have been attacked by off-leash dogs in leash only areas before, and while I was walking my dog and while I was riding my horse. They also chase wildlife. Tanner Park is a good dog off leash trail only. They do not mix well with other trail traffic.

Response: An off-leash dog is not pedestrian traffic. It is off-leash dog traffic, which is its own type of traffic and is quite incompatible with the other types of traffic the trails currently support. Few if any trail users want a surprise encounter with an off-leash dog, and--I know this may come as a surprise to dog owners--there are many trail users who don't even want a NON-surprise encounter with an off leash dog.

38. Alternating One-Way Travel

Ann's is an example of a great trail in both directions, but many ride at speeds too fast for its poor sight lines, leading to conflicts + accidents. Ann's (any trail, really) could be one direction on odd days (or, T-TH-S) and the other on even days (or, M-W-F-Su), allowing safe travel in both directions. Also, it would be great to build some one-way bike-only "rolling" trails, (like Ann's). The one-way trails we have now are climbs and downhills... but 1-way "roller-coasters" are stellar, too.





- 1. The city removed the bike lane on this road. Please add another option (trail somewhere nearby), or at least complete the sidewalk all the way up the hill.
- 2. Please improve the trail crossing here before someone dies. We need a crosswalk and/or reduced speed limit on Suncrest Dr.
- 3. Please keep this sidewalk open in the winter. We still need to go places in the winter, and there is no other reasonable route nearby.
- 4. There are a number of dog friendly trails nearby Peak View trail head, but due to the watershed boundaries, no easy way to get to them from Draper. Can the watershed boundary be changed to include Peak View?
- 5. Need a solution on speeding vehicles near the Manilla/ Manti junction especially near 282 and 281, although there is a sign limiting the speed to "20" but we see vehicles coming down and going up at speeds higher than that regularly. We have had accidents in the past where properties have been damaged near 282 and 281 Manilla drive. May be a speed breaker may help ! Resident 282 E Manilla Drive
- 6. "I want the trails here to connect and get finished, but there is an irrigation reservoir that could be a danger to pedestrians especially young kids playing in the reservoir / dam area. Is there a plan to fence & amp; gate this area to keep the public out of the irrigation area? Also where will the water users have access to use and maintain their equipment?"

- 7. I am SO worried the new and unending development will elongate the dog park. We've lived here since 2009 and it's the one thing we do every week, at least once but usually 2-3 times! Save Draper offleash park!!
- 8. Don't eliminate the dog park! The unending development is making this area overcrowded and undesirable. Yet another housing developing is going up at the dog park. Where will we go where there isn't a risk of running into traffic?
- 9. This is waaaaaay too close to the road for an offleash dog park. As I recall this was in the last version of the plan several year ago. Please don't move the dog park to this area where dogs could potentially run into traffic.
- 10. I find it ironic that we're worried about dogs in the watershed when hundreds of bikes per day are riding right through the stream
- I believe this is Draper's only cemetery. On the home page it states, "The city has a strong commitment to provide..... cemeteries..." There is lots of space on the west side of the freeway where we could add another one to support those who would like to be buried in Draper. As far as I know there is no more room at this location.
- 12. The road that cuts Galena hills park in half is very dangerous during daylight savings little kids running in between cars in the dark on a 35 mile an hour road to get to the other side of the park When the front runner station was built the road was supposed to go around the park this needs to happen.
- 13. Regarding Carpe Diem: It should either be a downhill flow trail (bike

only, downhill only), or a two way multi user trail, not both. Having large jumps on a two way trail is ridiculous. This trail is going to hurt people.


- 14. Steep Mountain park has become more active at night after the park is supposed to be closed with loud kids and vandalism. There were shots fired there recently. I would like to see more police patrolling the park area at night.
- 15. Opposed to making 12230 S to 3rd East Roundabout connector road. It would make 3rd E an already congested/ hazardous road into an extremely dangerous road. Making this connection road would only cause increased traffic, congestion, and reduce safety. 10 years ago Draper's Street Plan/Master Plan included making 12230 S to 3rd East a connector road. That may have made sense back then – but not today! 12200/12230 – now consists of several high residential housing Parc Day Dairy Apartments12200
- 16. The buffer zone park between the Galina Hills neighborhood, and the TOD. Has over 50 dead trees, when the developer built the park the trees were dead the first winner. Maybe three years ago. Draper city should have force the developer to replace the trees has a warranty issue. Is this a Draper city Park now? If so why is it not listed that's a green space on the city map?
- 17. Traffic during soccer season is incredibly dangerous and frustrating. If you're a soccer participant, being able to see past the cars parked on Vista Station to turn left or right out of the parking lot is impossible, especially when there are families crossing that busy street on foot. If you're traveling on Vista Station, it's difficult not to be upset at all of the frustrated soccer drivers who are impatiently cutting you off to get out of the lot. Seems like an accident waiting to happen.
- 18. With more bike traffic combined with the fast vehicles on suncrest dr you'll need to add some more things to make it safer for people to cross the road where trails start/stop/cross.
- 19. Having all the soccer games at Galina means that it takes at least 45 minutes to get to the game during rush hour as 123rd is a mess.

- 20. This spot will kill a cyclist one day. The north side of the street has a sewer grate in the bike lane. The opposite side of the street has another grate and a VERY poorly placed telephone pole. This means there is nowhere for cars to go. There isn't room here for a bike to avoid the grate and two cars to pass. The fact that there is no contiguous sidewalk on Pioneer is a shame, but this is really dangerous
- 21. I hope this area and most other marked in green remain undeveloped. I listen to the coyotes down the hill and worry about the loss of habitat as further developments go in on the border with Highland. It was a sad day when the seasonal pond/marshy area on the north side of Suncrest was developed. We no longer see the turkeys and other wildlife there.
- 22. The trails are getting more crowded each year, especially with the industry movement to E-Bikes. Can we restrict certain trails from E-Bike like other trail systems do (i.e Park City)?


"I have an Idea/Suggestion"

bike trails to designate new trails for electric mountain bikes and dirt bikes. There is already a dynamic of opposition setup amongst many mountain bikers, but the electrified group is large and getting larger quickly. Please address this community with locations to ride.

- 19. All of this open space should be an extension of Draper Park. More fields of grass for recreation and more parking. Ideally all of the remaining Fitzgerald farm property should be turned into more open space for a park and community recreation center.
- 20. To reply to the idea next to me... I know there is significant resistance to dirt bike riding because of the noise. A good compromise would be focusing on electric dirtbike options!
- 21. These tennis courts are used all the time! It is very difficult to find courts to use in Draper. The High School courts are supposed to be "public" courts, but I have been kicked off multiple times by the school team. I started playing tennis a few years ago thanks to the lessons offered by the city and I know several others who have done the same. Sandy has lots of courts, but they are all in disrepair. We need more public courts in Draper!
- 22. Is there an opportunity to do more sports fields in these empty fields behind Texas Instruments or add soccer goals to Suncrest Park?
- 23. Love the new Hawk signal, but would love to see an underground pedestrian tunnel here one day. The grading in this spot would make it very easy to put in
- 24. I think there are access issues and from what I gather much of this area is County owned... BUT... I wish there was some way to revive the dirt tracks in this area for electric dirtbikes and other ebikes. If not here then an electric dirtbike track should be considered on other city property. They are quiet! These bikes aren't going away and are getting more popular. With all of the effort focused on the mtn bike trails, there is an entire community ignored here that is growing quickly.
- 25. Consider placing signs with QR codes around the canyon (at all of the trail heads) for and easy way to make small donations for trail

maintenance and improvements. If people occasionally donate \$1, it would add up. It may be especially helpful to give specific trail improvements that people could fund. That would build excitement and allow the city to see what people are actually interested in.

- 26. Please find a way to connect the trail that goes through the pond to other trails
- 27. "It seems like Draper Residents Tax Payers Money is used for a lot of these trail implementations and maintenance. Can we charge non-residents a fee (i.e. a daily or annual parking pass), which would help pay for the trail system that they use?A parking permit is something that can easily be checked by the Draper Police (Ranger) in the parking lot."
- 28. City council always says "the dog park was cleaned up, there is no construction waste there." SO tired of fighting this. Would they finally clean it up once and for all? The Rebar in cement is the scariest because sledders or snowshoers could impale themselves on it.
- 29. It would be great to have a trail/bridge here connecting the neighborhoods south of the rail road tracks to the Porter Rockwell trail, while providing better access to the mountain biking trails for the neighborhoods north of the rail road tracks. This would allow people from both neighborhoods to avoid walking/riding next to busy roads (point express way) to get access.
- 30. It would be nice to have a bench (or place to sit) along the Porter Rockwell trail. There used to be a bench by the drinking fountain (Osborne Ln?) - but it would be nice to have another bench (closer to 1300 East?) for older individuals that may need to stop and rest. Also, there aren't many trees along this trail to provide shade from the summer sun... could a few trees be planted (south side of trail- as to not obstruct the views of the salt lake valley) to provide shade and beautify the trail?
- 31. Please consider building a Draper City sports complex with multi use outdoor fields (baseball. lacrosse, soccer) tennis courts, pickle ball courts, an all accessible playground? Indoor courts facility (basketball courts, indoor youth soccer fields) when this land is developed. The



Galena park outdoor fields are great, but the population growth has overwhelmed ball fields for practices, games and youth league use. The time to do this is when this State Prison property is re developed.

- 32. Draper has a big focus on the outdoors and recreation. We should have a big focus on culture and the arts, as well. Can we do more with our amphitheater and/or other locations? Big band dances in the summer, like at the Gallivan Center maybe? Live music and food trucks?
- 33. A part of the new development once the prison is gone, you should strongly consider building a big enough Park to host Draper days. One nearby example would be the Sandy promenade across from their City hall. As this is a great venue to host the 4th of July and their 9/11 memorial and the other festivities that they provide here. As the concept provides a great parade route that isn't too congesting on the day of, and the agreement of using commercial parking lots to park everybody is genius.
- 34. Anxious for some more clean up for the river; looking for both habitat preservation and use for recreation. Previous improvements have been appreciated. Looking forward to locations to put kayaks or SUPs on the river, especially once we can improve the pollution and water quality a bit more.
- 35. A circuit of fitness equipment would be great at this park (or elsewhere). It could be in a single location, or spread out along a trail. Nothing complex or easily broken like the last time we attempted this at Draper Park. Just simple stations for exercises using body weight. (i.e. pull up bar, pushups area, triceps dip bench or bars, etc)
- 36. Please put a pathway around Honey Bee Park. There are plenty of families who use the park and a pathway around, even just a gravel path would be nice. When soccer players are playing the games, the moms and dad will walk around the park, and it would be better to have an actual pathway.
- 37. Looking for locations that might be good for a disc golf course or two here in Draper. Hopefully somewhere not so windy.
- 38. I've always wondered why there isn't a small shuttle bus that comes

through the neighborhood and down to shopping districts. Why not have a natural gas or electric shuttle size bus that loops around harmons at bangerter and up 3rd east to 123rd shopping, then east to highland, and around the temple and back up again? Great for kids and older folks.

- 39. I am also in favor of designating more uni-directional trails. Canyon Hollow UP ONLY, Ghost falls, DOWN ONLY. No alternating days, just always.
- 40. Both Canyon Hollow and Ghost are great trail in both directions. It would be a shame to make either of these uni-directional.
- 41. I've always thought the green dirt canyon below the Jacob's ridge would be a great spot for a more techy downhill. Something unique from other trails in the area.
- 42. As this is not in the water shed, I know so many who would love to have bike trails with trail dogs allowed off leash in this area.
- 43. Although it's used a lot for uphill travel, Canyon Hollow is one of the more fun and flowy downhill trails here. It's especially fun at night when there are less people and you can see a bit better if night lights are coming up the trail. Please don't consider making this an uphill-only trail.
- 44. With the growing interest of dirt bike riding, would it be possible to create a trail for dirt bikes only. Just a thought.
- 45. It would be amazing to add some ability equipment to this location. There are festivals, parties, and so many gatherings here that family's who have children with special needs would love and appreciate.
- 46. There is only one fire pit at Draper park. We could use another at this location or possibly a few at Wheadon Farm.
- 47. Right behind city hall there is a huge field that would make a fabulous location for a field house. We have to rent space from the County Rec Center. Draper City would benefit having their own field house...equip with indoor soccer fields, basketball/volleyball courts and other things. Our field house should be in the heart of our city which is also close to



the police station. Bonus.

- 48. This bike trail should connect with the one over by Wheaton Farm Park
- 49. It would be amazing if the existing paved trails system in draper could connect to the Jordan River parkway.
- 50. Please add more trails! Both mountain bike and hiker-only. This area has so much potential.
- 51. Better connectivity with the new Lehi trail system in this area would be great. I love the new trail over from Ann's.
- 52. Is there any plan to connect this trail to Draper park or any other trail for trail connectivity?
- 53. Other half of old KMart. Field house, indoor pickle ball courts, etc.
- 54. The Galena Hills dog park could be better utilized if in the winter one of the lights from the baseball diamond was turned to shine on the park with a timer. I see lots of people with flashlights after daylight saving time
- 55. More bike only trails in this area please.
- 56. Please put in a little trail connecting Osborn and the lower neighborhoods to the Draper REcreation Center that crosses the old rail road trax and through that last neighborhood Rockwell Vista. It would be amazing to have older kids be able to ride their bikes to the Draper Pool or be able to head up and work out at the recreation center.
- 57. pickleball courts would be an amazing add to this poorly used park!
- 58. Add some tennis/pickleball courts to this park area with lights for evening play.
- 59. We need a way to get bikes out of the canyon without them being on the gravel road. Much safer for hikers, horses and uphill bikers.

- 60. With the increased use of trails by mountain bikers, can we make the trails 1-Way on alternate days? (E.g. Canyon Hollow up on even days, down only on odd days). There are several trails that are good up and down trails where this could be implemented. This would increase both enjoyment and safety.
- 61. The people living in this neighborhood have kids that are growing out of toddlerhood, and adding something to this large park for older kids would be wonderful. We specifically would love a basketball court, but would be open to other things provided they would age well with teens. Just make sure you place it away from the houses so they wouldn't have to deal with wayward basketballs, please. Other great ideas: more challenging rock wall, mini splash pad/water feature, net climbing tower.
- 62. Soccer games would be greatly improved if the grass was shorter on the fields.
- 63. Instead of allowing this to be developed, it would make a great park. Parking around Draper park is challenging and it's pretty far away for the residents in this area of draper.
- 64. It would be great to start to include a "Dirt bike" trail in this area, it a a huge growing sport and it would compliment a lot of the corner canyon area.
- 65. Soccer games should have a 15 min delay between the 5:30pm games and the 6:30pm games. Starting the 6:30pm games at 6:45 would drastically help the congestion
- 66. The other half of Kmart should be used for some sort of shopping. Treehouse is right next door. It wouldnt make any sense to turn it into a field house in this location.
- 67. Would love to see some more ways to protect the trails when it's muddy. I see too many people riding in the mud and destroying the hard work/money/time of the current trails. More signs showing closures and more gates closures when wet would be nice to protect the trail system.



- 68. This area is going to be a trailhead and I'd like to suggest it be added to the master plan. It will help connect Porter Rockwell to Mehraban wetland park. Currently teenagers have cut a hole in the fence and enter that way. It will also add additional parking for the Mehraban wetland park.
- 69. I would love to see Mercer completed as a single track trail. The road pieces are boring and are frequently used by horses where conflicts could be avoided if there was more single track.
- 70. I would love to see a different route from the middle of Jacobs toward the middle of peak view.
- 71. This implies there's a trail that goes over or under the highway, through the prison, almost all the way over to the Jordan River trail. I don't think there is IoI. BUT -- it would be great if we could have a real connection from Porter Rockwell over to the JRT -- much like was done to connect to the trail (and new overpasses) in Lehi.
- 72. Seems like there is a lot of open space that I don't often see used here. Maybe we could have some type of court as already suggested; or a small dog park?
- 73. Would be cool to have small riding track at the parking lot (Rush parking lot) for little kids. Something where you could sit and watch your littles to laps.
- 74. It would be great to have light here, after daylight savings ends. The park is hard to use in the dark and it gets dark so fast in the winter.
- 75. We would like to suggest some paths between some houses to get to the trails easily e.g. from Old Saddle to , so that you don't have to go all the way up to a main street to join a biking or hiking path.
- 76. If you had a master plan to build a long distance mtb race circuit all around draper, something like 50 miles, you'd have a yearly revenue source where people would come and do an annual 50 mile draper mtb race. lots of revenue and fun could be had with that master planned 50 mile course to support the trails!

- 77. I've heard rumors about making Ann's uphill only for bikers. I think that's a great idea would definitely benefit hikers (and uphill bikers) and help w/ flow. However, Ann's is a long trail if it's going to be uphill only, I suggest you make options to cut out early new trails/ other ways back down. As a beginning/easy trail, many new mountain bikers don't have time or skill to make it all the way to the corral yet, but doing a portion of Ann's is great. They need an alternate way down.
- 78. This trail is more of a dirt road that hasn't had any upkeep aside from a tractor cutting down the reeds once a year, but they grow back fast making the road unusable to walkers. This would be a lovely place for a more maintained walking trail.
- 79. Carpe Diem is such a great addition. It however should be bike DH traffic only. With Jumps and berms, it's built for fast flowy downhill use. AS such it should be DH bikes only.
- 80. I miss having a playground here. I think it was removed when the larger park went in up the hill (near the trailhead). There are a lot of kids in the townhouse community (across the street) and no place for them to play without having to walk along the busy road up that incredibly steep hill to the large park. It would be really nice to have a playground within walking distance, especially for the kids without yards.
- 81. Need more bike only trails to separate bike/hike traffic
- 82. And the end of Rush where the water puddle is all year long a small bridge would make a lot of sense.
- 83. Is there any way we can add a bridge to connect the sidewalks? There is already a grass/pavers path between the two houses on Old English, it would be great to be able to cross the canal here!
- 84. I'm extremely disappointed that we all can't just get a long. I hike and mountain bike and really enjoy the trails. I believe sharing is the best option but since Draper City believes that isn't a great option then the next best option is additional downhill mountain bike trails. These provide safety for all users and since we now have hiking only no bikes allowed trails then we need to balance that out.



- 85. Gap jump over the stream!
- 86. This is a useless dead-end street right now. How about filling it with Pickleball courts for now? There are no parks anywhere near here.
- 87. I saw somewhere a recommendation for an off leash dog park somewhere in this area. I think that would be a great use of the space.
- 88. Buy this and put in a soccer field and pickle ball courts.
- 89. I love the Corner Canyon trail systems but feel like we should have more downhill only mountain bike trails similar to Rush on this side. It provides additional safety for all users. We have a lot of space available and downhill mtb trails keep everyone safe.
- 90. achtung, baby has a lot of potential. It is a DH designated trail but it seriously lacks in many ways. It could use a little TLC and attention. That might bring some more people to this side of the area.
- 91. This would be a great location for a fun little jump line. Good fall line with access off the existing trail. Unused open space currently. Would help make the existing trail their more used as it would create a desire to ride in this area. I'd even build it myself so no need to spend money on it.
- 92. Another great area for a small jump park to play and let it be developed and used. Cool terrain features that would make it a fun area.
- 93. Love the bike only trails! This areas would be great to develop a few more down hill only trails to complement the maple hollow DH trail
- 94. More DH trails off of Ann's to get more people to go down those instead of Ann's. Ann's can be 2 way traffic for access but generally people that want to go down faster will get off Ann's and onto one of these trails for less issues. More DH trails between Ann's and Clark's and maybe Clark's down to connect to rush part way through as well.
- 95. Absolutely love this park and my kids have a blast on the different


tracks. Would love to see continued development with wood features and drops with adequate run way

- 96. The mud flats where the horse race track used to be, could be acquired from the federal government. And used as a new Draper city cemetery. The ground is a floodplain for the Jordan River but I think a cemetery would be a complementary use even if once every hundred years it floods you could use the waterFrom the water treatment plant to the south
- 97. This vacant lot on Manilla drive has a trail that connects the lower neighborhood trail to the upper neighborhood, steep mountain park, and the bonneville shoreline trail! If the city doesn't purchase this lot for a trailhead neighborhood park this connection will be lost forever! It's worth buying the lot and securing this access point and view.
- 98. The Telegraph Loop trail is awesome! One issue I have found is with people leaving their dog poop bags all over the trail. Just this morning, I saw 6 bags in the middle of the trail. Maybe a garbage can at the trail head with a big reminder sign would be helpful. I have seen the signs already in place, but maybe having a place to dispose of the waste would encourage people to carry it out.
- 99. Make Canyon Hollow Up-Hill Only. Add an additional "Bikes Down-Hill Only" (maybe an easier alternative to Rush). Canyon Hollow seems to get too crowded with uphill and downhill traffic.


- 25. LOVE the dirt jump area! The Maintainers do an EXCELLENT job!

The meeting was an open house format where attendees could ask questions or provide comments.

Summary of Comments

Recreation/Programming

- Soccer clubs want lighted fields at East and West Galena.
- Need lights at the South Fork softball complex.
- Need indoor rec opportunities/rec center owned by Draper City with basketball, pickleball and soccer.
- Need indoor pickleball courts.
- More outdoor themed programming, such as nature hikes and educational programs for kids on trails.

Parks

- It would be wonderful to have more pickleball courts. Even create a pickleball complex that could host pickleball tournaments. You can look at Brigham City as an example. There needs to be wind screen for the courts at South Fork.
- Draper is a progressive community. I love living here. It would be great to add the sport of
 pickleball yes there are the Wheadon courts and the courts at the Senior Rec Center which
 need some additional improvements. Wheadon needs wind breakers (screens) and the Senior
 Center needs a fence. There is duck poop all over and the balls go flying. Some more courts
 would also be great! Indoor and out!
- Pickleball courts crowded at Wheadon and others. Maybe add some at Draper City Park or Galena Park. Would love indoor courts too, but more outdoor courts is the priority.
- West Bluff disc golf course would be awesome!
- Make sure the community has enough large parks that provide multiple uses.
- No funding for the bike park maintenance this year! What is the City doing with all of the
 revenue those users bring to the City? 200 500 bikers per day go through the bike park, which
 is a huge amount of wear and tear. Bike teams also use it. The special features here require

Valley View Trail intersections need better signage as well (at Upper Oak Hollow and Valley View Trail junction and below). Sign directing to Ann's is confusing at this intersection.
- Love the off-leash dog trail area.
- E-bikes clarify city policy and come up with a plan to address potential conflicts.
- Against alternate days for hiking/biking on trails.
- High school teams have a big impact on the City's trail system. As more trails are built out in the region, this impact will be more distributed as those teams go to more local trails.

- Need a hiking-only connection between Hidden Meadows Trail and the Jacobs Ladder trail.
- Need Streetlights along 1800 S to Kimballs Lane. Both for people using Kimballs Lane station and for the kids walking home from the sports fields, especially since it gets dark so early.
- Connect mountain trails to city trails across highland Dr.
- Vote against altering days for types of trail use.
- Better signage indicating trail types
- A place for large groups, like the high school mountain bike team, to indicate day, time, & tail they will be using so others know when there will be high traffic and can avoid those times if they want.
- City trails should be maintained to ensure use by pedestrians and kids on bikes is possible. Some areas have branches that hang too low for bike use.

The meeting began with a summary of the purpose of the Parks, Trails and Recreation Master Plan update, followed by introductions.

The discussion on specific ideas, concerns or issues regarding trails in the City is summarized below.

Discussion Summary

- Would like to see more directional trails for mountain biking. Ups and downs get crazy trail
 etiquette is a challenge
- The City does a great job for the most part, but there are a few areas that need additional signage. Limelight needs improved signage.
- Give user groups their own trails. Conflicts mostly occur on multi-use trails. -May have to add
 more trails. Hiking only are nice, but if multi-use is needed, uphill-only biking with hikers is safer.
- Thoughts on alternating days for user groups to help manage conflict
 - Hard to get implemented but Millcreek has made it work and most people obey the rules.
 - Corner Canyon is headed towards being that busy too. Corner Canyon has more hiking only, not like Millcreek. Can always hike on trails without bikes.
 - Hope people are given enough information, really to want it to be a last resort. Better solution is to separate by users groups.
 - Would rather do anything other than have alternating days City has talked about having a pass system, but it would be hard to enforce (too many access points, too many entrance points).

- There aren't enough bikers to need that People note that the city has done a good job at marking the trail (bike only, hike only, no horse) so good signage is crucial.
- Redevelopment of the prison site will likely connect the Galena Soo'nkahni preserve to the rest
 of the City through the site.
- Not always easy to access the river except for a few key trailheads. The Point development will help. Greenway through the project is intended to connect range to river for recreation and for wildlife.
- Look at trails for wildlife value to connect/reconnect eco system.
- People wanting to recreate on the Jordan River may not realize there is not a lot of water in the river through Draper certain times of the year due to diversions for irrigation.
- What role can Draper City play to make the Jorden River more of an asset? Look at the 2016 Open Space Master Plan.
- Where does the water in Jordan river go? Jordan River Commission has been doing a lot for boat launches, one at Rotary Park, also in Sandy and Bluffdale. Add water component to this master plan.
- City has a good instructional area, would like other options for instructional with shorter trail loops, not enough parking, it can be busy.
- It would be awesome to have other options to mix things up like Little Valley but with better parking.
- Cycle Park is missing small trails for beginners to practice on like the two lower sections of Limelight. Consider instructional trails on back side of Suncrest, by Brookside. Have some of the features such a small drop for students to learn on. Anything with progression would be awesome. Cycle Park has plenty of parking.
- Things that could go up on the ridge is dog friendly trails, off leash area, instructional tails, Frisbee golf.
- More technical stuff, looping off of Woods Hollow, already super busy, can handle shoulder season. Lower Mountain would give longer use, south facing by Rattle and Hum, similar features near Cycle Park progressive rock garden, nice turns, progression of skills. Clinics are usually 3-4 hours, would only add extra 10 minutes.
- Area by Deer Ridge, make it an off leash area where people would hike with their dogs. Also add disc golf.
- Need dog/bike trails too.
- City talking about small loop of off leash trails, directional would be great.
- As the Point grows, that will add pressure to system, not enough access, one-way in and out on bikes.
- Could we turn Ann's trail into one way up hill for bikes and let everyone use is in both direction
 and on the other side construct a bike only trail? You must give bikers another down hill bike
 trail to make that work. Turn Ann's into one way uphill with multi and add another downhill
 bikes, need 2 ways off top off hill.
- Turn Longview Trail into uphill only and Carpe Diem into downhill only? Right now both are multi use. Carpe Diem is more technical, not built for hikers, Longview is better option. Some say carpe diem would be better as downhill only for bikes.
- Connection from Longview to Peacemaker by pond will be a hiking only trail. Forget-Me-Not ties from Longview by pond, like Jungle. Need a backcountry adventure trail that ties into Hoof 'n' Boot.

- The longest loop is about three miles and it would be nice to have longer trails about 5-6 miles for a 3 hour hike (loops are great for hiking).
- City does a great job with trailheads.
- The committee has a donor that may pay for another trail for a bike only trail in the Carpe Diem area as long as we keep a balance with hiking trails.
- Forget-Me-Not was finished two weeks ago. Is more like the Jungle Trail and ties into the Hoof 'n' Boot. Forget-Me-Not may eventually connect over into next drainage, tie around using Three Falls. There's an old road that's not official - consider making that official, it's a fun hike. Draper owns about 1/3 of the trail into the Three Falls area.
- Hoof 'n' Boot is an out and back trail and it would be nice to be made into a loop and it's almost one with the old road. We are working on making the connection from the switchback to connect to the larger trails.
- Trailhead amenities Everyone thinks they are working just fine.
- Paved trails Likes loop with Porter Rockwell and Canal Trail, would be great to take Porter Rockwell to the Jordan River Trail. Trails do go around Point of Mountain on Porter Rockwell down to Lehi. Good option.
- Telegraph connecting other trails to Lehi? Traverse Traverse does this. Lehi working to get connection to Maple Hollow Trail (part of BST) by Brookside – tie into this area from Telegraph. Lehi has been building trails, good partner.
- Want to extend from Longview switchback to connect to three falls, extension of BST on wish list.
- Try and identify some area to do a trail like Lupine with one of these areas where you can take your dog we should try and make that a priority because people would love it. Lupine popular with families, need another like it. Maybe up on top of hill or valley behind Suncrest sign? Long Branch is one option. Also see opportunity off of Telegraph (4 mile loop) add mile loop within it.
- Need somewhere people can take their dogs on the trail.
- How are we doing with the equestrian committee?? Landmark will be contacting Katie Ovard-Smith.
- Jordan River Trail itself has been used by equestrians mostly in Bluffdale. South of Rotary Park, was some south of Rotary, south of 12300 towards Corner Canyon Creek, then along should into Bluffdale where there is a nice soft separated trails. Fewer horse properties long river than there used to be but are still a few there. Bluffdale still has a lot of equestrian properties.
- Blueprint Jordan River update, had survey done in 2020 for entire river by Envision Utah, can get responses possible from Draper zipcodes (Cody Lutz).
- Representative Harrison developed some legislation for safe routes to school and how can we make trails a part of that and expanding some of that legislation to save routes to parks. We lack the infrastructure to support those places and make them more accessible beyond a car.
- For the most part we a lot of neighborhood trails but need to push/map these neighborhood connections to build more of them.
- We are getting ready to revamp the Jordan Rotary Park and we need to look at connecting that amenity. Jordan River Commission is pushing for more programming and park development area along Jordan River. The Commission would like to participate in other focus groups.
- There are some big gaps in trails behind IFA, canal trail by Bellevue to Wheadon Park.
- City is revamping Draper City Park playground, connecting it will be important.

Conversation with Katie Ovard-Smith: Equestrian Community on 10/25/21

- Love the trails in the City.
- The Hoof n' Boot trail is pretty far up Corner Canyon and is really the only equestrian trail in the City.
- She was raised in Draper and has horses at the same house she grew up in. She has ridden Corner Canyon her whole life but has only ridden Hoof n' Boot once because she has to exercise five horses and doesn't have time to do the full three hours it would take to do the Boof n' Boot.
- Many equestrians ride the trail a lot at least once a week.
- Most people that use the trail are Draper residents and most people she knows like to ride their horses from their houses instead of trailering.
- To get to Hoof 'n' Boot, equestrians have to go through a lot of bikes to get there. The City
 needs to have a horse/foot only trail connection from the Equestrian Center (Andy Ballard
 Events Arena) so that they can avoid the bikers.
- All of the bike teams are troublesome too much of a conflict with the horses. It's not that they shouldn't be up there. The uses just need to be separated. People want to ride closer to home without getting stuck in the bike teams.
- If she or others are going to go to the effort of trailering their horses, they'll go to Dimple Dell or Yellow Fork which are more equestrian friendly.
- There are trailheads in the City that accommodate equestrian trailers.
- The Equestrian Center is owned by the City Andy Ballard Events Arena
 - Not just for equestrians
 - \circ $\;$ Where they hold the rodeo and riding club practices $\;$
 - o Outdoor facilities only
- Hikers and horses are okay together
 - People don't always understand how to deal with horses
 - Horses need to have people talk to them so the riders know they're there, and so the horses can know they're just encountering people and don't get spooked. People tend to want to get quiet around horses.
 - It's nice when people will move off the trail, but some people don't think horses shouldn't be up the canyon and don't yield to horses like they are supposed to.
- Loves having the trail system there she lives at the mouth of the canyon.
 - It's good for the horses to be out of the arena sometimes, to see the trails and have a relaxing workout. A separated access would make this much easier for equestrians in the City.

- Kids wanted to be in musicals and plays odlest is out of the house now
- Most cities this size don't really have a venue
 - We have the amphitheater good in some ways
 - Not really designed for theater, designed for concerts, value engineered
 - Tried to improve where they could
 - Sandy has great amphitheater kicked their arts guild out now just concerts run by a third party
 - Have partial ownership of a theater with the canyons CD
 - o Proposed partial ownership of a theater to the city
 - Canyons was building a new JR high, city partnered, fractional ownership Mt. Jordan Middle School, sandy arts guild donated with a matching grant from the county \$1.5 million – has an amazing theater
 - Sandy has a given # of weeks per year they they can use it
 - Here a theater \$15 \$30 million is unrealistic fractional ownership
 - Could use for arts, dance, etc., but partnership is great option
 - American Prep Academy was going to build a new theater and were interested in partnering – City didn't have interest

 - Camp had slots for 50 kids this year amphitheater is hot, and no heat either venue is challenge – used the rec center – rent was high – trying to figure out something different this year
 - American prep academy has been good partner use their indoor space for some activities and events though they don't have a theater
- Canyons School District is difficult, expensive, not good communication \$6,000 to \$8,000 to rent school for performances and rehearsals



- No storage at amphitheater have a storage unit, underbuilt for anything like that, but there's tremendous location

 - Send letters out to owners of historic structures to ask if they want assistance with repairs – homeowner have to match 50% of the grant value or volunteer their time working on the project
- Respond to demolition requests
 - If a request to demolish a building in the City is received, the Commission checks out the house to see if it' historically significant
 - Commission may request a more intensive level survey to make sure it's not historically significant
 - \circ $\;$ If it's not historically significant, they will just sign off on the request
- Used to host a Booth for Draper Days
 - $\circ \quad {\rm Had\ info\ about\ projects\ they\ were\ doing}$
- Hosted an event when plaques for Draper historic park were handed over to City and held a
 groundbreaking when Day Barn was given to the City
- No current plans now for additional signage and programs



- Parks department is usually doing a project and that starts the conversation about what to do for that particular facility
- Draper library timbers were taken from Dale T. Smith's old barn did a sign there showing the old barn and the timbers

- Have a lot of places within Draper that could use some interpretation
 - Fans of the old widowmaker race
 - Flight Park community is worried that's going away, UTA transit hub development, if they design that building wrong it could wreck the airflow on the side of the mountain that generates the updraft – community loves the flight park – there has been good cooperation on the project – heard developers wanted to build high rise buildings on Utah County side of the mountain
 - Movie Rock the Devil's Brigade movie was filmed there
 - Jacob's Ladder Trail original access to Movie Rock Road early hiking/hunting trails, used to be able to drive 4wd to Lone Rock – was an adventure sport center – tell that story in this hub
- River isn't historic in the same way as the City center but there are interesting elements there, many of which are not publicly conveyed very well

 - Completed in 2012 close to where Galena Creek enters

Lisa Benson of Landmark Design interviewed representatives individually. Conversations are summarized below.

Individual Interview with Bo Jensen, Southeast Valley Baseball

- His league needs more fields. Had to turn away 70 kids this past year because teams and fields were maxed out.
- Baseball had a downturn for a few years but is growing again.
- Other leagues have one field and have concessions to help offset costs.
- Southeast Valley Baseball (SVB) is a non-profit, run at a zero balance by the end of the year.
- Have to spread their games and practices out between Draper and Sandy not one location.
- Lose fields to adult sports not just adult baseball/softball, but other programs are using the baseball fields as well.
- Games are fun but practices are where the real development occurs. No baseball fields are available for practices using grass fields but doesn't give kids the same experience.
- Games are held at Draper City Park, South Fork Park and Galena Park. Only get Galena Mondays, Wednesday and Fridays, get South Fork on Fridays. Also use two fields in Sandy but would love to have it all at one place.
- League has 72 teams mid 500's for participation numbers each year on average.
- 75% are Draper kids, rest are kids from Sandy. Have boundaries between different leagues around the valley, so they cover Draper and Sandy.
- Ages: 4 18
- Run into super league teams with kids from all over the valley SVB serves local kids. The super leagues complain about them taking fields, but SVB serves local kids.
- Some safety issues with the fields in Draper:
 - Backstops bottom are all wood and causes weird ball bounces
 - o Mounds get left out get worn out spots that cause uneven spots and tripping hazards
- AVB partners on maintenance with the City.
- Have a good relationship with the City, but they have a lot of demands
- Would welcome lighted fields (like Galena has) at South Fork would be able to play until 9:30 or 10 pm.
- Want to be more of a partner pay a fee now and all volunteers but would be willing to contribute more to help out want to take pride in the fields.

- Tournaments are at season's end All-Star mixed league tournament at the end of the season, have to host an age division – SVB is limited in the age divisions they can host because of the size, days, lighting issues with fields.
- Want to do a larger tournament that would attract more from out of state, like the Heat Stroker which runs through the night. The City does one for softball like that.
 - Tournaments can help with economic development in the City some can bring up to 300 teams through - need good facility to host it though. West Jordan/Copper Hills, Riverton are all good examples. Needs:
 - Capacity to host 4-5 games at a time
 - A concession booth
 - Nets to catch fly balls
 - Scoreboards for everyone to keep track would be great (scoreboards are controlled by hand-held remote – need some accessible system for all users – not just City staff)
- Wayland gets a lot of demands/requests Bo feels like they're fighting to keep the league alive, tough to turn kids away.
